

BILL OF RIGHTS FOLDABLE

1. Notice how the 6 layers are evenly spaced.

2. Take the top and fold it over to make 12 total layers! You will want the layers to remain even.

3. Hole punch and staple at the fold. I like to fold again after the hole punch so when I write under the tabs I don't go above a certain point.

5. Above each tab is information about that label. For example, above "1st Amendment" will be info about freedoms of religion, assembly, speech, press, and petition.

4. Label each of the layers as shown.
